

Sir Hervey Bagot

A powerful local lord he was educated at Trinity College, Oxford
Justice of the Peace in 1623
Sheriff in 1626–7
Royalist sheriff 1642–3
MP in 1628 and again 1641

Description

Sir Hervey Bagot was not allowed to sit as an MP in 1642 after raising troops against the elected parliament.

As a punishment some of his property was taken from him in 1643

Both brothers fought against parliament at Naseby in 1645 and after they were defeated returned to Lichfield.

Richard was wounded and when he died he was buried in the cathedral.

His brother took over as commander of the soldiers in the close in 1646

Where do you live?

Lived after this in the close at Lichfield, where the royalist garrison was under the command of one of his sons, Richard and his second, Hervey, was in command of a regiment of foot.

He tried to get to Stafford to surrender but the siege started and he stayed in the Cathedral close.
